### From the Vicar

When he entered the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came to Jesus as he was teaching, and said, 'By what authority are you doing these things, and who gave you this authority?'

Jesus said to them, 'I will also ask you one question; if you tell me the answer, then I will also tell you by what authority I do these things. Did the baptism of John come from heaven, or was it of human origin?'

And they argued with one another, 'If we say, "From heaven", he will say to us, "Why then did you not believe him?"' (Matthew 21.23-25)

Do you like riddles? - I do, so let me ask just a few. They aren't too difficult, but you will have to think a little.

What holds water even though it is full of holes? It is a sponge!

What gets wet when it is drying? It is a towel!

When I am filled, I can work or play; when I am empty, I do nothing all day. What am I? It's a glove.

Jesus liked riddles too. Sometimes he used a riddle to teach people a lesson.

One day Jesus was teaching in the temple. The priests and elders of the temple didn't believe that Jesus was the Son of God and they were upset because he had been performing miracles.

"Who gave you the authority to do these things?" they asked Jesus.

Jesus said, "I will ask you a question and, if you can answer me, then I will answer you. Here's my question. Did the baptism of John come from heaven or from men? Where did he get his authority?"

The priests couldn't answer Jesus' riddle. If they said it was from heaven, Jesus might ask them why they didn't believe John when he said that Jesus was the son of God. And if they said it was from men, the people would turn against them because they believed that John was a prophet of God.

The only way they could answer was, "We don't know."

Well, maybe the priests and elders didn't know who gave Jesus the authority to perform miracles, but we do. It was God, his Heavenly Father!

## **BOILED PINEAPPLE/FRUIT CAKE**

### **INGREDIENTS:**

1kg Mixed Fruit  
1 cup Dark Brown Sugar  
310g. Butter  
450g Crushed Pineapple  
4 eggs  
2 cups Plain Flour  
2-1/2 cup S.R.Flour  
1 tspn. Mixed Spice  
1/2 tspn. Bi-Carb  
Vanilla Essence

**METHOD:** Set Oven at 150 c Place Mixed Fruit, butter, Sugar and Crushed Pineapple (incl. Juice) into pan. Add ½ cup water for extra moisture Bring to the Boil, stirring until sugar dissolves. Reduce Heat. Simmer for 5 minutes. Allow to cool (I place contents of saucepan into mixing bowl and place into fridge)

Beat eggs lightly – adding vanilla essence. Stir into fruit mixture Sift flours with mixed spice and bi-carb. Fold into mixture

Pour into greased and lined cake tins Bake for 1-1/2 – 1 3/4 hours or until cooked. Makes 2x 20cm cakes or 3 loaf cakes

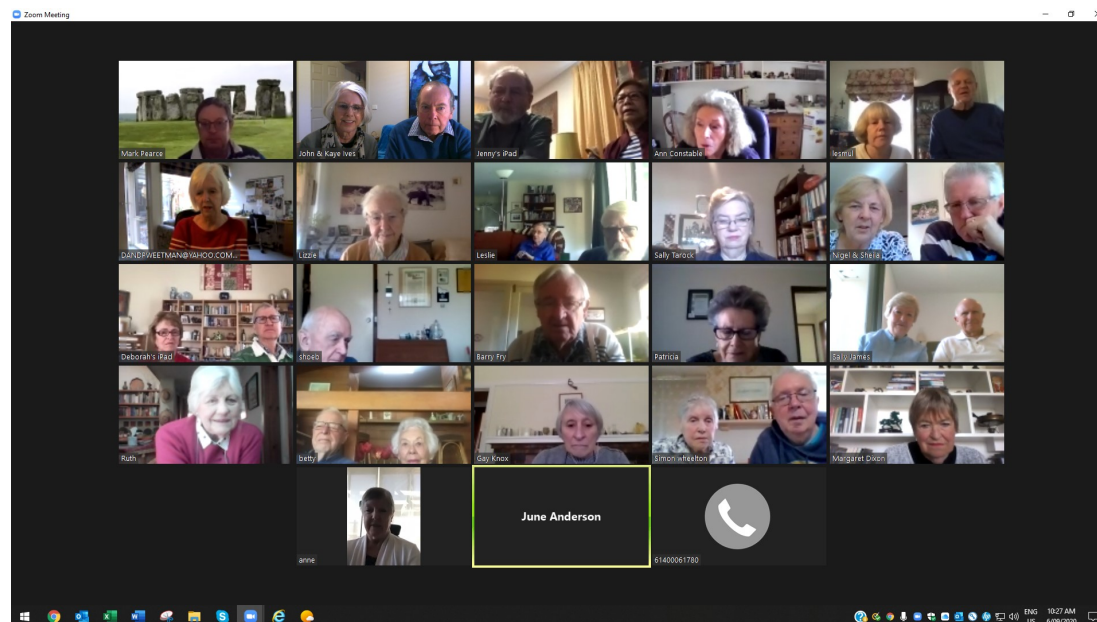
